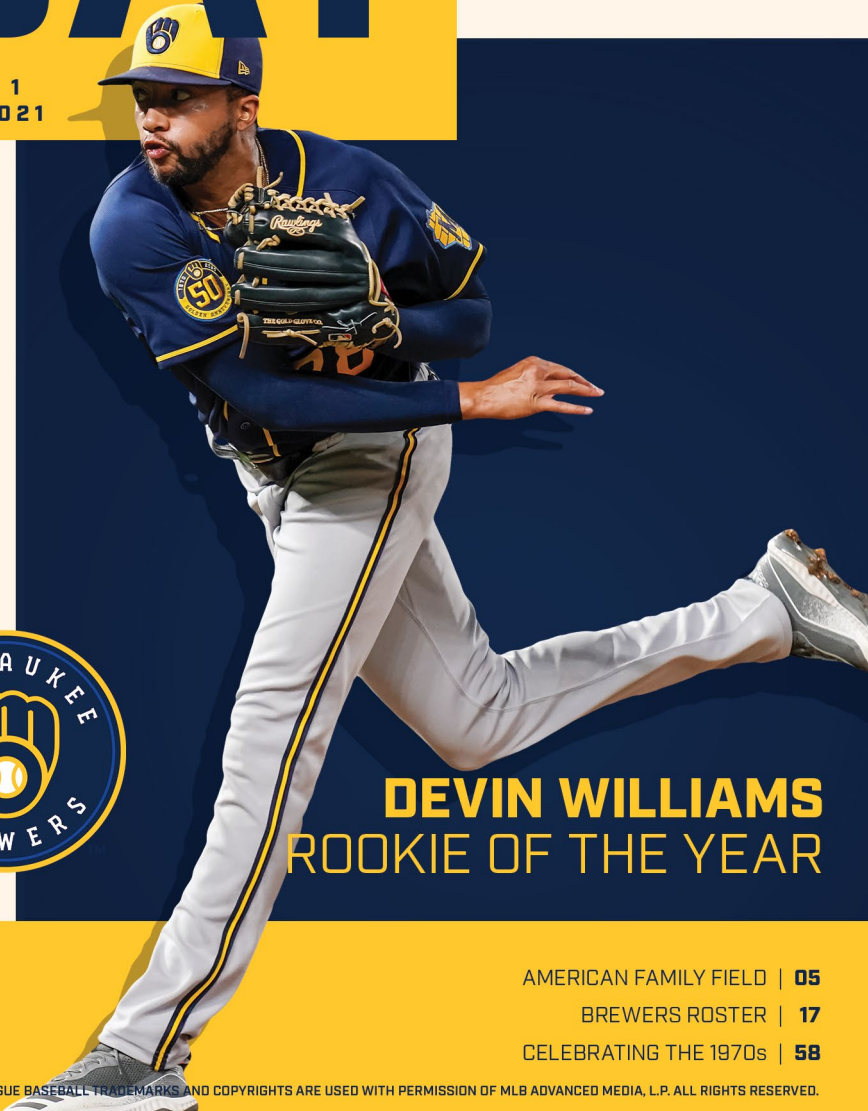

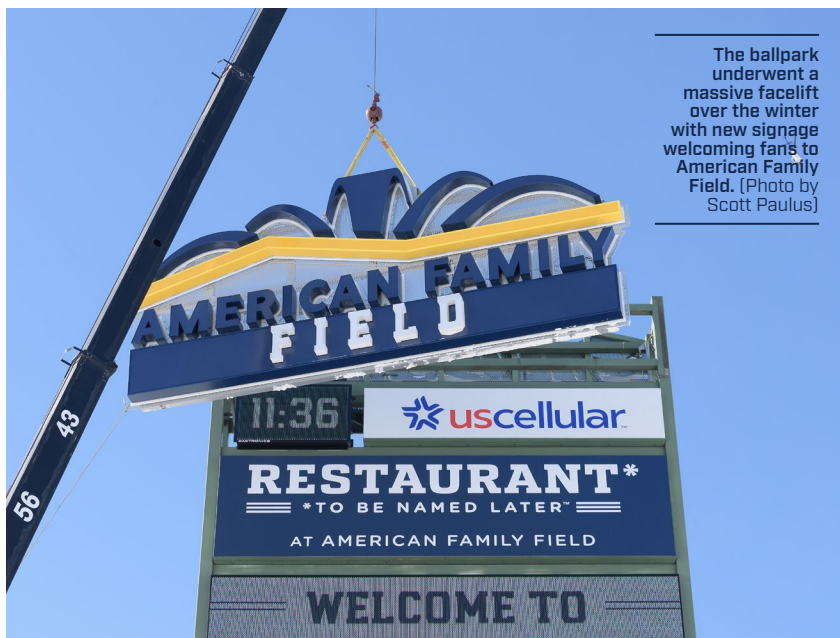

RED CARPET ROLLED OUT IN A NEW ERA OF BASEBALL

As one glorious era ends, another begins.

Once the calendar flipped to 2021, the highly anticipated genesis of American Family Field welcomed the next generation of Brewers fans to the ballpark.

How fitting that for the first time since September of 2019, the red carpet is rolled out after a year-long spectator absence due to the novel coronavirus pandemic. Last month,

the City of Milwaukee Health Commissioner Kirsten Johnson approved a plan to open the ballpark initially at 25-percent of total capacity or roughly 11,000 to 12,000 fans. That percentage could increase if the health metrics improve as the season progresses.

“This is exciting for us, as well as our fans and partners who we know are eager to return to American Family Field,” Milwaukee Brewers President – Business

Operations Rick Schlesinger said. “Our players repeatedly say that Brewers fans bring phenomenal energy to the game and are the critical piece of the ballpark atmosphere.”

Known as Miller Park from its unveiling during a County Stadium ceremonial countdown back in 1996 to its official grand opening in 2001 to hosting memorable postseason appearances to its farewell amid the coronavirus pandemic →

in 2020, the state-of-the-art ballpark now celebrates a new moniker to call home following a partnership and naming rights agreement between Madison-based American Family Insurance and the Brewers.

“We think this is a beautiful relationship that will grow stronger,” expressed Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett. “The city of Milwaukee is very excited about this and I want to thank American Family for their investment and believing in this ballclub and believing in this city.”

Under the iconic convertible roof built high above the playing field and the emblematic version that has draped its namesake’s logo for nearly 60 years, baseballs will continue to fly over the outfield walls to cheers that have made the ballpark one of the game’s most fan-friendly experiences.

“We are honored and grateful to be part of Milwaukee and Wisconsin – our home state for nearly 93 years,” said American Family President Bill Westrate in a press statement. “The American Family Field

logo is as much about the Brewers and their fans as it is about us, and that sentiment is reflected in the logo’s design.”

The logo was created by Infinite Scale of Salt Lake City, Utah. It is topped with the familiar outline of the retractable roof of the ballpark and the symbolic roofline highlighted in the American Family Insurance logo. The scheme embraces the Brewers’ colors.

“American Family has deep roots with the Brewers and has been a Brewers partner since 2001. It’s a great Wisconsin heritage brand,” said Brewers President of Business Operations Rick Schlesinger. “A partnership of this magnitude and significance does not happen without vision, perseverance, strategic leadership and hard work.

“It’s an alignment of two great Wisconsin brands. It’s a partnership with a company that is active in a community that cares about diversity and inclusion with its citizens so they can make a better place to live and work.”

Miller brands will continue to have

a presence at the ballpark as it remains the exclusive beer at the stadium. Schlesinger noted that the two Milwaukee partners will explore other sponsorship opportunities for the future.

“We appreciate the historic commitment of MillerCoors and the Miller Brewing Company to Milwaukee and our team,” Schlesinger added. “We also look forward to continuing our relationship for years to come.”

Variations of the new logo prominently appear throughout the footprint of the stadium, particularly on the exterior side of the ballpark over the main entrance and on the major free-standing video board adjacent to I-94. In the interior, a massive logo sign appears atop the scoreboard.

American Family Insurance also has the naming rights to the team’s Spring Training facility called American Family Fields of Phoenix. The complex reopened in 2019 following a massive \$60 million expansion and renovation subsidized by the ballclub. ●

The Brewers Baseball Academy continues to be a sought-after

Under the supervision of Rappé and his staff of instructors, the camp provides baseball and softball instruction by experienced youth coaches and is open to youngsters age 6-14. Most camps sell out quickly. Each camp runs Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 3 p.m.

Camper safety is our top priority and we continue to follow all local health and safety guidelines. During one of the five camp days, with restrictions permitting, campers will visit American Family Field* for a one-of-a-kind experience to play on the home field of the Brewers.

A unique component of the Brewers Baseball Academy is the option to have a video motion analysis performed where a camper’s swing will be recorded, analyzed and shared with the player and his/her parents. In addition,

all participants will take part in a baseball or softball skills competition.

Each week, scores will be posted at brewers.com/camps and upon completion of the last camp [Aug. 23-27], the top scorers will be invited to the Champions’ Day Finals at American Family Field*. Boys and girls will compete separately in appropriate grade groups.

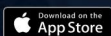

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

DEVIN WILLIAMS EARNS WELL-DESERVED ACCOLADES

In less than three years, Devin Williams' career went from being stalled by Tommy John surgery to being hailed as one of the best relief performances in the Major Leagues.

In the process, he earned the 2020 Jackie Robinson National League Rookie of the Year Award and the Trevor Hoffman Award as the NL Relief Pitcher of the Year.

Williams became the third player in franchise history – the first pitcher – to earn Rookie of the Year honors, joining shortstop Pat Listach (1992) and third baseman Ryan Braun (2007).

In addition, the lean right-handed pitcher became the first rookie and the first pitcher without a save to earn the Relief Pitcher of the Year award. Coupled with Josh Hader, who earned the award in 2018 and 2019, the Brewers have now won three consecutive Hoffman Awards.

Last season, the 26-year-old had a dominant campaign, posting a 4-1 record and a stingy 0.33 ERA in 22 appearances. He ranked first or tied for first among Major League relievers (minimum 20 innings pitched) in ERA (1st),

opponent batting average (1st, .090), WHIP (1st, 0.63), strikeouts (T-1st, 53 – led NL) and strikeouts per nine innings (T-1st, 17.67 – led NL).

As incredible as it may appear, Williams gave up just one earned run the entire season. It came in his second appearance on the mound. On July 27, the Pirates' Colin Moran hit a solo home run with one out in the seventh inning. After that, Williams was near flawless over his remaining 20 appearances, allowing just six hits in 24.2 innings of work, walking seven and striking out 49 batters.

"Honestly, I never thought I'd be in this position," Williams said following the Rookie of the Year announcement. "It is a culmination of all my hard work. It was nice to get recognized."

Humbled by the honor, Williams praised the entire Brewers' bullpen.

"It shows how good of a [bullpen] we have if I can win these awards, and I'm not even good enough to be our closer," Williams told *MLB.com*, referring to Josh Hader, Milwaukee's closer. "I don't think saves are the be-all end-all. If I come up in the seventh inning and I go through one through

five, I think that can be pretty valuable as well."

Hader, who earned 62 saves over the last three seasons, was thrilled for Williams. "I think he's deserving of that [award], without a doubt," Hader shared with *MLB.com*. "It's not a question to me, the things that he's been able to do – especially as a rookie coming in. It's the confidence in him."

Since joining the Brewers in 2019, Williams has made a name for himself with his electric fastball and a changeup coined, "The Airbender," by Rob Friedman @PitchingNinja.

"I just hold it like a circle changeup," Williams explained. "It was something I started to play with as a kid. I started to mess around with the movement and it developed over time into my changeup."

But his journey to the big leagues didn't come without some adversity.

In 2013, the Brewers did not have a first-round pick in the First-Year Player Draft, surrendering it after signing free agent Kyle Lohse. Milwaukee had to wait until the 54th overall selection to land Williams in the second round. →

A standout at Hazelwood West (MO) High School in north suburban St. Louis, Williams was projected as a possible late first-round pick. Unaware of the Brewers' interest in him, Williams was hoping to land with the hometown Cardinals.

"I got passed by every team, some teams more than once," he said at the time. "So there's a little bit of a chip on my shoulder. My hometown team passed on me twice, so they've got some revenge coming here

in the future."

Williams labored for three seasons in the Brewers' farm system, working mainly as a starter and posting a combined 8-19 record at the Rookie and Class-A levels. It wasn't until 2016, when he opened the year with a 6-3 mark at Class-A Wisconsin of the Midwest League, that he finally felt a sense of accomplishment.

Heading into Spring Training, he had renewed confidence

in his ability. But soon after arriving at Minor League camp his conviction was dampened by a devastating injury, a setback that would wipe out an entire season.

"I felt like I was just getting it together and the next thing I know I have a torn UCL and out for basically a year and half," he said. "It was a tough road."

The road to recovery was something he was willing to accept. He quickly understood the importance of rehabbing and the time it would take to get back on the mound. The toughest thing was there were no guarantees at the end of this rainbow. Fortunately, the Tommy John surgery was deemed a success. The following season, he began a measured course to build up arm strength. Sometime in 2019, Williams finally trusted that his elbow had healed.

"I have so much respect for anyone who has been through a 'TJ' rehab," Williams said. "You go to the field for rehab and then you get to go home and think about if you are ever going to be as good as you were.

"It's mentally taxing. →

You have to attack your rehab and say that you are going to come back better than before. Some people do. Some don't. At the end of the day, you don't really know until you get back on the mound."

When he returned to the hill with Double-A Biloxi of the Southern League, Williams could see gradual improvement. But his days as a starter were over. He resigned to the fact that he was now a relief specialist.

The more he came out of the bullpen the more he liked the results. His performance over 31 appearances in the first half of the season with the Shuckers garnered Williams a respectable 7-2 mark and 2.36 ERA.

This affirmed that he was officially back. And yes, he was better than before.

"It has been fun learning to come out of the pen," he said at the time. "I like coming in late in the game when it matters most. I get a real adrenaline rush."

Following a short stint at Triple-A San Antonio

of the Pacific Coast League, Williams received word on August 5 that he would be heading to 'The Show.' Two days later, he made his Major League debut against the Pirates, setting his dreams to pitch in the big leagues in motion.

His journey was complete. He had overcome all the obstacles.

Not only did he make it to the majors, but he enjoyed an unpredictable campaign, surprising most experts, except the Brewers – who believed in his ability from the day they drafted him.

Williams owed his physical comeback to the Brewers' medical and training staff. But just as important, he was thankful for his family who kept him in the right frame of mind.

"It's never necessarily been easy for (us)," Williams said, referring to his mother, Angela, who raised him and his sisters as a single parent. "Just seeing the way she handled

adversity...that really just kind of set the tone for the way I live my life.

"She's been my rock, and together with my grandma and grandpa, they've always been there for me. They showed me the will to keep fighting when things don't go your way.

"And when I look back, I think it was all worth it. Everyone has their own obstacles to get over. In the end, when you've put in the work, having this kind of success is most gratifying." 🏆

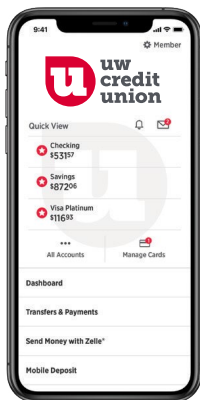

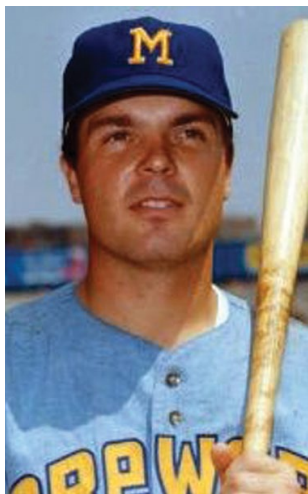

STEVE HOVLEY

STEVE HOVLEY - OF (1969-79)

Originally drafted by the Angels in 1966, Hovley was selected by the Pilots in the 1968 Expansion Draft and was a utility outfielder in 1969. In the Brewers' inaugural game at County Stadium against the Angels on April 7, 1970, Hovley batted fifth in the lineup against California's ace Andy Messersmith. After the first four Brewers were retired, Hovley laced a single past second baseman Sandy Alomar in the second inning to record the first hit in Brewers history. He followed that up with a walk, a double and another single. Despite the 12-0 loss, Hovley had a perfect Milwaukee debut collecting three of the team's four hits in the game.

GEORGE W. BUSH

April 6, 2001 – The first official game at Miller Park was scheduled as a night game, pitting the Brewers against the Cincinnati Reds. President George W. Bush was part of the special pregame ceremony. Richie Sexson's eighth inning home run lifted the Brewers to a 5-4 win before 42,024 fans. David Weathers earned the victory in relief of starter Jeff D'Amico. This is the first season the ballpark is called American Family Field.

Series Notes: These two franchises have played each other every season since 1969. Last year, the Brewers and Twins played six times in a revamped COVID-19 schedule. Since 2018, the Brewers have won nine of 15 meetings with the Twins, and since 2010, the Brewers are 15-11 against Minnesota at home.

2020 Season: The Twins won the American League Central Division crown with a 36-24 record. In the AL Wild Card Series, the Twins were swept and eliminated, 2-games-to-0, by the Astros.

Twins Expectations: In each of the last two seasons, the Twins have won division titles only to be swept out of the postseason. In fact, Minnesota has dropped 18 straight playoff games - dating back to 2004 - a dubious statistic Manager Rocky Baldelli will try to correct in 2021. The Twins are loaded with weapons, both on the mound and at the plate, as they go for their third straight Central Division crown. Minnesota's starting rotation is built around Kenta Maeda, José Berríos, and Michael Pineda, who combined for more than a third of the Twins' victories last season. The bullpen is a work in progress with closer Taylor Rogers as its anchor. There's plenty of firepower in the lineup with the likes of Nelson Cruz, Josh Donaldson, Max Kepler, Miguel Sanó, Byron Buxton and newly acquired Andrelton Simmons at its core.

Series Spotlight: 04.08.1992 - B.J. Surhoff hit a walk-off grand slam with two outs in the ninth inning to rally the Brewers to a 9-5 victory over the Twins at County Stadium. The win was Phil Garner's first as a big league manager. Garner went on to register 563 victories - the most recorded by a Milwaukee skipper.

2020 Season: The Cubs won the National League Central Division crown with a 34-26 record. In the NL Wild Card Series, the Cubs were swept and eliminated, 2-games-to-0, by the Marlins.

Cubs Den: It's hard to imagine that the Cubs are rebuilding their roster after winning the Central Division last year – making the postseason for the fifth time in the last six seasons. Winner Randy Wolf benefitted from the onslaught, pitching six scoreless frames.

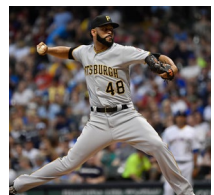

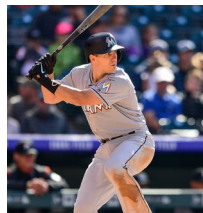

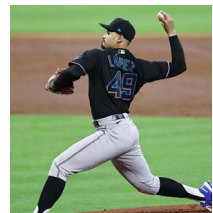

Series Notes: This is the Dodgers' only visit to American Family Field in 2021. The Brewers did not face the Dodgers during the regular season due to the coronavirus. The Brewers have not won a season series from the Dodgers since 2014, and have won only four season series since joining the National League in 1998.

2020 Season: The Dodgers won their eighth straight National League West title with a 43-17 record on their way to a World Series championship over the Rays, winning 4-games-to-2. It was LA's first title since 1988 and the seventh in franchise history. The Dodgers eliminated the Brewers, 2-games-to-0, in the NL Wild Card Series; swept the Padres, 3-games-to-0, in the NL Divisional Series; and defeated the Braves, 4-games-to-3, in the NL Championship Series.

Dodgers Doings: The Dodgers finally won the elusive World Series and is considered the frontrunner to repeat in 2021. The bullpen features Blake Treinen, Kenley Jansen and newly acquired former Brewers Corey Knebel. On offense, Mookie Betts, Cody Bellinger, Justin Turner and Corey Seager are the foundation of the Dodgers' lineup.

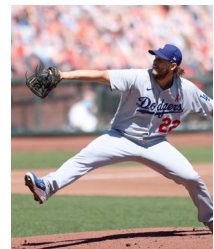

BREWERS GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATING THE 1970S

Ken Sanders stood out as the best relief pitcher in the American League when he was awarded the 1971 'Fireman of the Year' with a league-best 31 saves and 83 appearances.

The novel strain of the coronavirus pandemic may have spoiled the Brewers' plans to celebrate their 50th Anniversary last year but it didn't dampen the spirit of its historic significance.

In 2021, the Brewers will honor their Golden Anniversary of Major League Baseball in Milwaukee with all the pomp and circumstances rescheduled during this season.

From a chronology perspective, the franchise's humble beginnings were simple to define back in 1970 – there were no promises made or guarantees offered, just plain old big league baseball. →

And for a community that had been spoiled with success in the 1950s then crudely abandoned in the 1960s, having the game back was enough.

Perhaps it was the only time in Milwaukee's baseball history in which three different generations of fans came together to support an unheralded and orphaned franchise that hadn't even shed its expansion cloak, let alone have the wherewithal to sport its own talent-pool, worthy to strut in the limelight.

Nonetheless, it was adequate. Milwaukee and Wisconsin had a second chance at big league life. The city and state had a dateline again. The team filled with castoffs showed glimpses of stardom. Some prospects even had potential. If anything, time was on Milwaukee's side to build its Major League identity.

In the eleventh hour, Seattle's reluctant submission in bankruptcy court, together with MLBs blessing and

foresight, allowed the baton to be passed so that the defunct Pilots could become the Brewers just in time for the 1970 season opener.

There was no time to change the schedule – the Brewers would have to play in the American League West. The uniforms underwent a quick makeover; stripping “Pilots” off the jerseys and stitching “Brewers” in its place. New blue caps with a yellow “M” embroidered on them were purchased while the equipment manager scrambled to direct moving trucks heading out of Arizona to take a right and go east.

Even before scheduled starter Lew Krausse could toe the rubber against the California Angels, the new home ballpark had to be prepped and dressed in bunting to celebrate the arrival. A makeshift staff had to print and sell tickets in order to fill the grandstands.

And true to their baseball heritage, a curious gathering of over 36,000

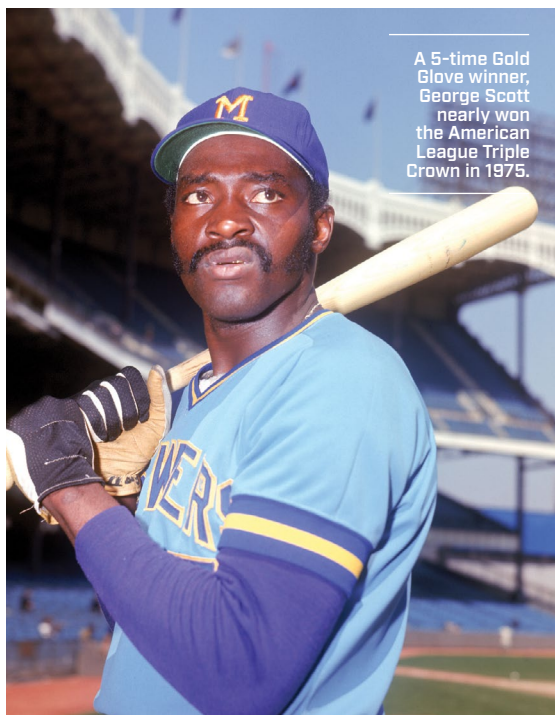

onlookers gathered at County Stadium on a sunny but crisp April afternoon. No one really cared that the Angels' Andy Messersmith tossed a 12-0 shutout because the American League had returned to its birthplace 68 years later.

The ballpark, first built with the vision of luring big league baseball to Milwaukee in 1953, was alive again with the sights, sounds and smells of our

national pastime. The fond memories of dad's stories of the Braves' heydays and grandpa's tales of their beloved Borchert Field Brewers were rekindled with the crack of the bat.

Just one year removed from being an expansion club, this collection of talent had to prove itself all over again. Nevertheless, its supporters were willing to tolerate mediocrity. It was better than nothing.

Though the Brewers struggled initially, the team did have some remarkable individual performances along the way.

In 1970, Milwaukee embraced three players as favorites. Danny Walton, who opened the year with eight home runs in his first 20 games, quickly drew the attention of fans in the left-field bleachers who eventually called themselves the "True Blue Brew Crew." Tommy Harper earned MVP votes when he became only the fifth player to hit 30 homers and steal 30 bases in a season. Marty Pattin won 14 games with a 3.39 ERA and 11 complete games to go along with 161 strikeouts for a team that barely won 65 games.

The following season, Ken Sanders made his mark when he was named the American League Fireman of the Year after chalking up 31 saves and a 1.92 ERA. He appeared in 83 games – finishing 77 of them – for a

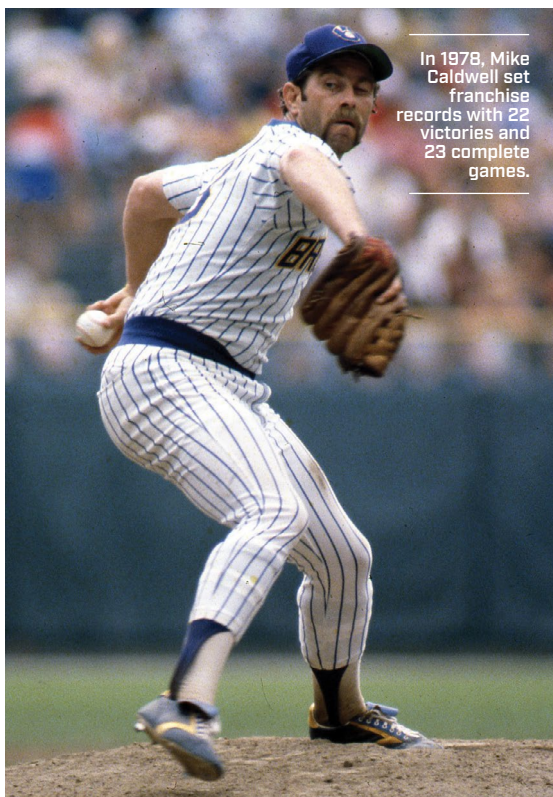

club record that still stands to this today. Jim Slaton marked the first arrival of a pitching prospect and he did not disappoint, winning 10 games in his rookie season. Slaton rose to the top of the Brewers' charts by the end of the decade and finished his career as the team's All-Time leader in games, starts, wins, innings, strikeouts and shutouts.

Over the next two seasons, the Brewers moved to the American League East and landed proven veterans like Don Money, George Scott, Davey May and Jim Colborn.

Money and Scott were considered two of the finest fielders in the game. Money set a league mark by playing in 88 consecutive errorless games while maintaining the best fielding percentage at the hot corner in 1974. Two years later, he equaled a Major League mark with 12 assists in a game as a second baseman. Money was a four-time All-Star during



the decade. Scott, who was a five-time Gold Glover at first base, also had tremendous power, winning two-thirds of the Triple Crown in 1975, with 36 homers and 109 RBI. May was a steady center

fielder and enjoyed his finest season in 1973 when he hit .303 with 25 homers and 93 RBI. Colborn was Milwaukee's first 20-game winner

when, in 1973, he posted a 20-12 record and 3.18 ERA with 22 complete games. Colborn holds the franchise record with 314 innings pitched that season. He also holds a mark when he pitched 13 innings against Baltimore in 1974.

Also that year, Robin Yount became the youngest player in baseball when he broke in at →

the tender age of 18. He took his lumps, including a franchise-record 44 errors at shortstop, but by the end of the decade he established himself as a solid shortstop who would go on to win a Gold Glove while leading the team to a pennant.

The pieces started to fall into place with the arrival of infielder Sal Bando in 1976. A member of three world championship

teams in Oakland, Bando was the first free-agent signing in team history.

Cecil Cooper followed in 1977, and Larry Hisle and Ben Oglivie came the following season.

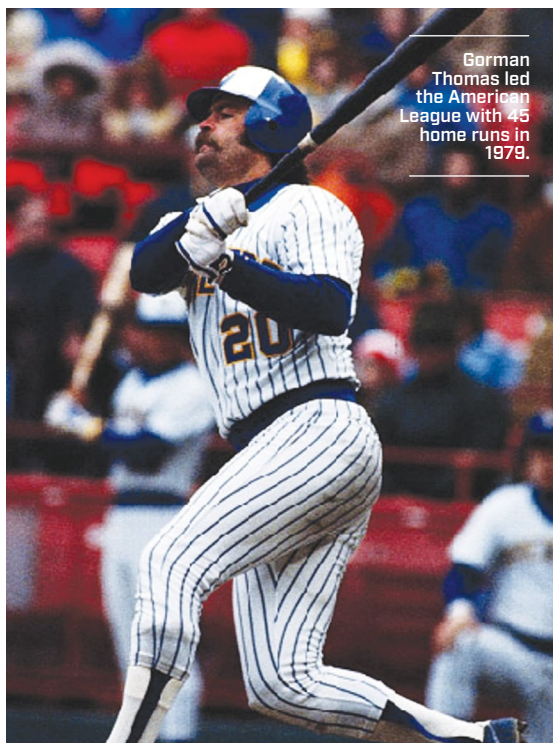
Cooper batted .300 or better over the next seven straight seasons, adding power and steady defense at first base. Hisle was one of the most feared hitters in the game and proved it by

finishing third in the MVP balloting after clubbing 34 homers with 119 RBI in just his first season. Oglivie hit over .300 with power from the left side of the plate.

But it was Gorman Thomas who became a fan favorite. Whenever Thomas came to the plate, fans expected one of two things to happen – a home run or a strikeout. The fans were seldom cheated. In 1979, Thomas topped the American League with 45 homers. The Brewers were dubbed “Bambi’s Bombers” in honor of Manager George Bamberger who was hired by General Manager Harry Dalton to turn the Brewers’ fortunes around.

Bambi did just that. Milwaukee joined the East Division heavyweights winning 93 and 95 games, closing out the decade with its first winning campaigns. No other Brewers’ manager ever guided the club to back-to-back 90-win campaigns.

But it wasn’t all about power. The →

Brewers had speed and defense with the likes of Sixto Lezcano, Paul Molitor, Charlie Moore, Jim Gantner and Yount – all products of the farm system.

Lezcano had one of the strongest arms in the AL, averaging 10 assists from the outfield per season over his seven-year Brewers career, including a record 18 assists in 1978. Besides being the leadoff hitter, Molitor led the team in runs scored and stolen bases his first two seasons. Gantner and Yount made a formidable keystone combination, leading the league in double plays. And Moore, who wasn't a prototypical catcher, showed a strong arm, speed on the bases and an ability to hit to all fields.

Under Bambi, it wasn't all about hitting. In fact, the

Brewers excelled on the mound, particularly the starting rotation, which set team records with 62 and 61 complete games in 1978 and 1979, respectively.

With a rotation that included left-handers Mike Caldwell, Bill Travers and Jerry Augustine and righties Lary Sorensen and Jim Slaton, they combined for 133 of Milwaukee's 188 wins over the last two seasons of the decade.

Sorensen was the Brewers' first pitcher to actually pitch in an All-Star Game, tossing three scoreless frames in the 1978 Classic. Travers and Augustine enjoyed their finest seasons under Bambi. In eight seasons with the Brewers during the decade, Slaton enjoyed his finest season in 1979 when

he won 15 games.

But it was Caldwell, a journeyman pitcher for most of his career, who flourished the most under Bambi. In 1978, Caldwell, who set team records with a 22-9 record, 2.36 ERA and 23 complete games, finished runner-up in the Cy Young Award voting. He then followed that up with a 16-6 mark, 3.29 ERA and 16 complete games.

Oddly enough, the Brewers opened and closed the decade by being shut out.

But Milwaukee wouldn't come up empty in the 1980s, going to the playoffs twice and winning its lone pennant. 🏆
